Its power resides in its capacity to transform landscapes, economies, peoples’ lifestyle and cultures, and in shaping identities, ideas, behaviors, by establishing new networks of power, forging new ideas and representations, and creating discourses of place and difference. Above all tourism is about encounters: encounters between people and places, and between people (Crouch).

Often these encounters are unbalanced, uneven, destabilizing, resulting in exploitation and abuse. But at times they are productive, creating wealth, and forging alliances between distant people. This conference intends to meet and discuss new research ideas on the tourism impacts in the Global South, focusing namely on the construction and transformation of landscapes through tourism.






Sure Road? Nationalisms in Angola, Guinea-Bissau and Mozambique



Privatising services as if people matter:
Solid waste management in Abuja, Nigeria
By Adedayo Oreye

There is an overwhelming focus on the state and the private sector in the language and policies of urban governance. This has led to a lack of attention to the role of citizens. A major consequence is the failure to comprehend and assess fully the potential of citizens to contribute to the development of their communities. The potential of our citizens to not only affect but also be affected by city governance is being overlooked. This article argues that the potential of citizens to contribute to the development of their communities is often underappreciated. It also argues that citizens' desire to contribute to processes in localities is the cornerstone of sustainable urban management. The article concludes by suggesting that the engagement of citizens in solid waste management is critical to the success of the programme. It also suggests that the role of public participation in the control and prevention of pollution of solid waste services can offer policy practitioners the opportunity to enhance the quality of life of citizens.

Privatising services as if people matter: Solid waste management in Abuja, Nigeria

There is an overwhelming focus on the state and the private sector in the language and practice of privatisation, even though it calls for a tripartite arrangement that includes the people. A major consequence is the failure to comprehend and assess fully the important role of the people. While the people have a major part in supporting privatisation through payment of user charges, they are not often seen as key partners by city governments in Africa. Public participation has important implications for finance and cost recovery.

Thus a people-centred approach to privatisation in which the users of services are consulted and involved in decision-making processes is crucial to the emergence of sustainable solid waste management systems in African cities. This study provides useful insights into the complexity of public participation in the context of privatisation of solid waste services and offers policy guidelines relevant to the major stakeholders.

Biafran ghosts: The MASSOB Ethnic Militia and Nigeria's Democratisation Process

The Movement for the Actualisation of the Sovereign State of Biafra (MASSOB), an ethnic militia, emerged in the Igbo-speaking region of Nigeria in 1999, shortly after military rule ended and Olusegun Obasanjo took office as elected President. MASSOB's stated goal is the struggle for Igbo self-determination and the re-emergence of a new sovereign state in the eastern part of the country to be known as the 'United States of Biafra', thereby raising the spectre of a possible break up of the Federal Republic of Nigeria.

This Discussion Paper examines the circumstances of MASSOB's emergence in a period of political transition and considerable uncertainty as the Nigerian armed forces began to prepare to relinquish their grip on power, and the specific ways the promoters of this ethnic militia movement have shaped Nigeria's still unfolding democratization process since 1999.


FOCAC: Twelve Years Late Achievements, Challenges and the Way Forward

At a higher level, the book presents challenges confronting Ghanaian tomato farmers as they are faced with flooding of the domestic market with tomato paste from European countries and weak processing sector.


Republicans on the Throne: A Personal Account of Ethiopia's Modernization and Painful Quest for Democracy




A Culture of Corruption: Every-day Deception Popular Discontent in Nigeria




Explorers of the Nile: The Triumph and Tragedy of a Great Victorian Adventure




Ambiguous Pleasures: Sexuality and Middle Class Self-perceptions in Nairobi


This fascinating book describes not only his eventful three year tour but the background and subsequent events that placed this small country at the centre of the world stage.


The State and the Social: State Formation in Botswana and its Precolonial and Colonial Genealogies

Botswana has been portrayed as a major case of exception in Africa—as an oasis of peace and harmony with an enduring parliamentary democracy, blessed with remarkable diamond-driven economic growth.




Cold War in Southern Africa: White Power, Black Liberation






Once again, the Horn of Africa has been in the headlines. And once again the news has been bad: drought, famine, conflict, hunger, suffering and death.


The Feasibility of the Democratic Developmental State in the South
